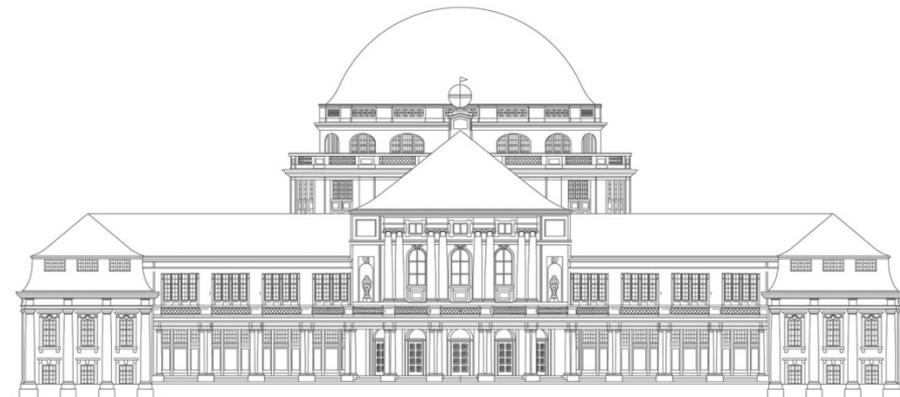

# Rasche's Model to Compare and Analyze Accountability Standards (2009)

	Content	Process	Context
Guiding Question	What content-related <b>rules</b> does the standard propose?	What <b>implementation processes</b> does the standard propose?	In which <b>context</b> can the standard be applied?
Exemplary Issues to Compare and Analyze Standards	<u>Specificity of Norms</u> Are the rules proposed by the standard specific enough to foster implementation?	<u>Implementability</u> Are the required implementation processes specifically laid out?	<u>Geographic Scope</u> In which countries/regions is the standard primarily used?
	<u>Legitimacy of Norms</u> Was the standard developed in a multi-stakeholder way?	<u>Accountability</u> Does the standard require the creation of accountability processes?	<u>Industry Focus</u> In which industry (or industries) can the standard be used?
